Most of the bright vibrant Fall Colored Leaves have now shriveled up and made their way to the ground. With the cold nights and high daytime winds it didn't take long this year.

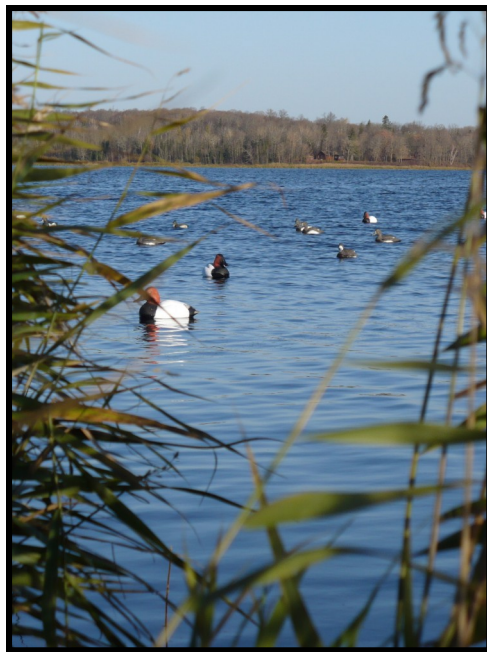
Fishing in Northern MN for the most part has been phenomenal the past several weeks. We have found both bigger photo fish and nice eater sized fish in 6' of water. Depending on the days conditions these active fish can be found in water as shallow as 4' and some days they have worked their way out to 12'. Targeting shorelines with vegetation is still key. Some days they are hiding in the thick cabbage while other days they are found cruiz-

ing in the thinner Sand Grass but either way a Northland Fireball tipped with a minnow is what they want.

This past weekend was the Minnesota Waterfowl Opener. Looks like Northern Minnesota has plenty of opportunities. Many different reports have been coming



in but one thing they all have in common is everyone is seeing birds. Bluebird Skies have made the hunts interesting and cold frosty nights have pushed the Teal and Woodies south but there are still plenty of local puddlers and divers. Check back often, we are just getting started!
