



Grand Rapids Area Fishing Report 6-1-2010

What an incredible weekend we have had here in Northern Minnesota. The weather was perfect for just about any type of outdoor activity including Fishing!

Walleye action continues to be above average. On windy days we are still using light Fireball jigs tipped with Spot Tail Shiners in roughly 6' of water. On the calmer days the same presentation is used but we find most of the fish have moved out to 12'-15' of water.

This past weekend I had the chance to fish one of the deeper more clear lakes in the area where water temperatures were already up to 68 degrees and the

Walleye preferred a 7' Roach Rig tipped with a crawler.

For the past 3 evenings we spent most of our time hooking crappie. I would have to say these were some of the best evenings I have had in a long time. Northland Slug Bugs and Scud Bugs seemed to work best pitched up



against bull rushes. Tie them under Northland's new weighted Lite-Bite Float for long casts and hang on! We have also been able to find a few crappie and gills hiding near submerged timber.

Smallmouth action currently is



as good as it gets since they are on their spawning beds. You can pretty much throw anything in front of them at this point and plan for continuous action. It's pretty amazing to watch them dart and zig zag in the shallows.

Things are just starting to heat up here in the Northland! Check back often for up to date reports.
